Virginia Regional Transit (VRT) is seeking bids for contract janitorial service at our Central Region facility located at 1099 Brandy Knoll Court, Culpeper, Virginia 22701. Bidders should submit bids in a **SEALED** envelope to the address stated above and clearly note the IFB number on the outside of the envelope. All bids must be received prior to the deadline to be considered. The deadline to submit a bid is **2:00 p.m., May 21, 2025**. All submitted bids will be considered lowest and best price and should include all fees, including labor and supplies. VRT is exempt from all sales tax related to this procurement.

Interested parties should contact the Office of Procurement at <u>jason@vatransit.org</u> or at 540-338-1610, ext. 2104 with questions. The Central Region facility will be open for a facility walkthrough on May 12, 2025, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. (without appointment).

VRT reserves the right to reject all bids. If beneficial, VRT may award contracts to bidders for the services mentioned below. All bidders and products must abide by the following FTA clauses (see attachment).

Note: VRT does not discriminate against faith-based organizations in accordance with the Code of Virginia (2.2-4343.1D) or against a bidder because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, disability, or any other basis prohibited by state law relating to discrimination in employment.

Equal Opportunity: Small, minority, and women-owned, Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE), as defined in 49 CFR Part 26, are encouraged to submit proposals in response to this solicitation. 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I. Purpose

The purpose of this Invitation for Bid (IFB) is to solicit bids and to establish a contract with one qualified source to provide VRT with semi-weekly janitorial services at our facility in Culpeper, VA.

Background

Virginia Regional Transit operates, manages, and plans fixed-route, demand response, and commuter transportation services. The organization delivers efficient, cost effective, and quality services for riders so they can move about their communities and live their lives fully.

II. Statement of Needs

Minimum requirements include:

Scope of Work

Cleaning is required twice weekly; Wednesdays evenings after 5:00 PM and anytime over the weekend.

- Sweep or vacuum all tiled and carpeted floor areas including behind doors and under desk with a concentration on high traffic areas
- Damp mopping all tiled floor areas with a concentration on high traffic areas, spills and scuffs.
- Dust all offices, meeting rooms and workspaces. This includes dusting all desktops, windowsills, wood wall trim, baseboards, and chair rails
- Clean and sanitize all kitchens. This includes cleaning countertops, sinks, microwave, and damp mopping the floor.
- Clean lunch breakroom. This includes wiping down the tables and chairs.
- Clean and sanitize all bathrooms. This includes cleaning sinks, countertops, toilets, and walls/partitions as needed.
- Clean the front entry foyer and lobby area. This includes cleaning the glass entry doors, the bathroom, and the waiting room seats.
- Empty all interior trash receptacles, replace the trash bags, and take the trash to a designated location. In addition, empty the two trash receptacles just outside the front and side entrance doors.
- Refill the paper towel, toilet paper, and soap dispensers in the bathrooms and kitchens.

VRT will provide paper towels, toilet tissue, hand soap, and trash can liners. Contractor's staff are asked to report when supplies are running low on any of these items.

The Contractor will provide cleaning chemicals and cleaning equipment.

Excluded from this scope of work are all areas outside of the main portion of the building. The Contractor will not be responsible for cleaning the bays, offices, and storage areas in the garage sections of the building, nor will they be responsible for cleaning the exterior areas of the building.

III. <u>Proposal Preparation and Submission Instructions</u>

General Requirements:

1. <u>IFB Response:</u> In order to be considered for selection, bidders must submit a complete response to this IFB. One copy is to be submitted. No other distribution of the bids shall be made by the bidder.

2. Proposal Preparation:

- Bids shall be signed by an authorized representative of the bidder. All information requested should be submitted. Failure to submit all the information requested may result in VRT requiring prompt submission of missing information and/or rejecting the bid. Mandatory requirements are those required by law or regulation or are such that they cannot be waived and are not subject to negotiation.
- Bids should be prepared simply and economically, providing a straightforward, concise description
 of the capabilities to satisfy the requirements of the IFB. Emphasis should be placed on
 completeness and clarity of content.
- As used in this IFB, the terms "must", "shall", "should" and "may" identify the criticality of requirements. "Must" and "shall" identify requirements whose absence will have a major negative impact on the suitability of the proposed solution. Items labeled as "should" or "may" are highly desirable, although their absence will not have a large impact and would be useful but are not necessary. Depending on the overall response to the IFB, some individual "must", and "shall" items may not be fully satisfied, but it is the intent to satisfy most, if not all, "must" and "shall requirements. The inability of a bidder to satisfy a "must" or "shall" requirement may result in the bidder being deemed as non-compliant.
- 3. <u>Specific Proposal Instruction</u>: Bidders should submit bids in a sealed envelope to the address stated on the IFB cover sheet and clearly note the IFB Number on the outside of the envelope. All bids must be received prior to the deadline to be considered.

- A. <u>APPLICABLE LAWS AND COURTS</u>: This solicitation and any resulting contract shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia and any litigation with respect thereto shall be brought in the courts of the Commonwealth. The contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations.
- B. <u>ANTI-DISCRIMINATION</u>: By submitting their bids, bidders certify to VRT that they will conform to the provisions of the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, as well as the Virginia Fair Employment Contracting Act of 1975, as amended, where applicable, the Virginians with Disabilities Act, the Americans with Disabilities Act and § 2.2-4311 of the *Virginia Public Procurement Act (VPPA)*.
- C. <u>ETHICS IN PUBLIC CONTRACTING</u>: By submitting their bids, bidders certify that their bids are made without collusion or fraud and that they have not offered or received any kickbacks or inducements from any other bidder, supplier, manufacturer or subcontractor in connection with their bid, and that they have not conferred on any public employee having official responsibility for this procurement transaction any payment, loan, subscription, advance, deposit of money, services or anything of more than nominal value, present or promised, unless consideration of substantially equal or greater value was exchanged.
- D. <u>IMMIGRATION REFORM AND CONTROL ACT OF 1986</u>: By entering a written contract with VRT, the Contractor certifies that the Contractor does not and shall not during the performance of the contract for

goods and services in the Commonwealth, knowingly employs an unauthorized alien as defined in the federal Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986.

- E. <u>DEBARMENT STATUS</u>: By submitting their bids, bidders certify that they are not currently debarred by the Commonwealth of Virginia from submitting bids or proposals on contracts for the type of goods and/or services covered by this solicitation, nor are they an agent of any person or entity that is currently so debarred.
- F. **ANTITRUST:** By entering into a contract, the contractor conveys, sells, assigns, and transfers to VRT all rights, title and interest in and to all causes of action it may now have or hereafter acquire under the antitrust laws of the United States and the Commonwealth of Virginia, relating to the particular goods or services purchased or acquired by VRT under said contract.
- G. <u>CLARIFICATION OF TERMS</u>: If any prospective bidder has questions about the specifications or other solicitation documents, the prospective bidder should contact the buyer whose name appears on the face of the solicitation no later than five working days before the due date. Any revisions to the solicitation will be made only by addendum issued by the buyer.

H. **PAYMENT:**

1. To Prime Contractor:

- a. Invoices for items ordered, delivered and accepted shall be submitted by the contractor directly to the payment address shown on the purchase order/contract. All invoices shall show the state contract number and/or purchase order number; social security number (for individual contractors) or the federal employer identification number (for proprietorships, partnerships, and corporations).
- b. Any payment terms requiring payment in less than 30 days will be regarded as requiring payment 30 days after invoice or delivery, whichever occurs last. This shall not affect offers of discounts for payment in less than 30 days, however.
- c. The following shall be deemed to be the date of payment: the date of postmark in all cases where payment is made by mail, or the date of offset when offset proceedings have been instituted as authorized under the *Virginia Debt Collection Act*.
- d. Unreasonable Charges. Under certain emergency procurements and for most time and material purchases, final job costs cannot be accurately determined at the time orders are placed. In such cases, contractors should be put on notice that final payment in full is contingent on a determination of reasonableness with respect to all invoiced charges. Charges which appear to be unreasonable will be researched and challenged, and that portion of the invoice is held in abeyance until a settlement can be reached. Upon determining that invoiced charges are not reasonable, the Commonwealth shall promptly notify the contractor, in writing, to those charges which it considers unreasonable and the basis for the determination. A contractor may not institute legal action unless a settlement cannot be reached within thirty (30) days of notification. The provisions of this section do not relieve an agency of its prompt payment obligations with respect to those charges which are not in dispute (*Code of Virginia*, § 2.2-4363).
- I. <u>PRECEDENCE OF TERMS</u>: The following General Terms and Conditions APPLICABLE LAWS AND COURTS, ANTI-DISCRIMINATION, ETHICS IN PUBLIC CONTRACTING, IMMIGRATION REFORM AND CONTROL ACT OF 1986, DEBARMENT STATUS, ANTITRUST, CLARIFICATION OF TERMS, PAYMENT shall apply in all instances. In the event there is a conflict between any of the other General Terms and Conditions and any Special Terms and Conditions in this solicitation, the Special Terms and Conditions shall apply.

- J. QUALIFICATIONS OF BIDDERS: VRT may make such reasonable investigations as deemed proper and necessary to determine the ability of the bidder to perform the services/furnish the goods and the bidder shall furnish to VRT all such information and data for this purpose as may be requested. VRT reserves the right to inspect a bidder's physical facilities prior to the award to satisfy questions regarding the offeror's capabilities. VRT further reserves the right to reject any bid if the evidence submitted by, or investigations of, such bidder fails to satisfy VRT that such bidder is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the contract and to provide the services and/or furnish the goods contemplated therein.
- K. **TESTING AND INSPECTION:** VRT reserves the right to conduct any test/inspection it may deem advisable to assure goods and services conform to the specifications.
- L. **ASSIGNMENT OF CONTRACT:** A contract shall not be assignable by the contractor as a whole or in part without the written consent of VRT.
- M. <u>DEFAULT</u>: In case of failure to deliver goods or services in accordance with the contract terms and conditions, VRT, after due oral or written notice, may procure them from other sources and hold the contractor responsible for any resulting additional purchase and administrative costs. This remedy shall be in addition to any other remedies which VRT may have.
- N. <u>TAXES</u>: Sales to VRT are normally exempt from State sales tax. State sales and use tax certificates of exemption, Form ST-12, will be issued upon request
- O. **USE OF BRAND NAMES:** Unless otherwise provided in this solicitation, the name of a certain brand, make or manufacturer does not restrict bidders to the specific brand, make or manufacturer named, but conveys the general style, type, character, and quality of the article desired. Any article which the public body, in its sole discretion, determines to be the equivalent of that specified, considering quality, workmanship, economy of operation, and suitability for the purpose intended, shall be accepted. The bidder is responsible for clearly and specifically identify the product being offered and providing sufficient descriptive literature, catalog cuts and technical detail to enable VRT to determine if the product offered meets the requirements of the solicitation. Normally in competitive sealed bidding only the information furnished with the bid will be considered in the evaluation. Failure to furnish adequate data for evaluation purposes may result in declaring a bid non-responsive. Unless the bidder clearly indicates in its bid that the product offered is an equivalent product, such bid will be considered to offer the brand name product referenced in the solicitation.
- P. **TRANSPORTATION AND PACKAGING:** By submitting their bids, all bidders certify and warrant that the price offered for FOB destination includes only the actual freight rate costs at the lowest and best rate and is based upon the actual weight of the goods to be shipped. Except as otherwise specified herein, standard commercial packaging, packing and shipping containers shall be used. All shipping containers shall be legibly marked or labeled on the outside with purchase order number, commodity description, and quantity
- Q. <u>INSURANCE</u>: By signing and submitting a bid under this solicitation, the bidder certifies that if awarded the contract, it will have the following insurance coverage at the time the contract is awarded. For construction contracts, if any subcontractors are involved, the subcontractor will have workers' compensation insurance in accordance with §§ 2.2-4332 and 65.2-800 et seq. of the *Code of Virginia*. The bidder or offeror further certifies that the contractor and any subcontractors will maintain this insurance coverage during the entire term of the contract and that all insurance coverage will be provided by insurance companies authorized to sell insurance in Virginia by the Virginia State Corporation Commission.

MINIMUM INSURANCE COVERAGES AND LIMITS REQUIRED FOR MOST CONTRACTS:

1. Workers' Compensation - Statutory requirements and benefits. Coverage is compulsory for employers of three or more employees, to include the employer. Contractors who fail to notify the Commonwealth

of increases in the number of employees that change their workers' compensation requirements under the *Code of Virginia* during the contract shall be in noncompliance with the contract.

- 2. Employer's Liability \$100,000.
- 3. Commercial General Liability \$1,000,000 per occurrence. Commercial General Liability is to include bodily injury and property damage, personal injury and advertising injury, products and completed operations coverage. VRT must be named as an additional insured and so endorsed on the policy.

(**Note to Agency/Institution**: When the requirement is for parking facilities and garages for motor vehicle maintenance contracts, the forgoing sentence should be changed to read: This coverage should include Garage Owner's Liability. Contracts with movers or truck transporters should also require motor carriers' liability. When in the judgment of a procurement officer, these limits and coverage are not warranted for the goods and services being procured, the Division of Risk Management should be contacted.)

4. Automobile Liability - \$1,000,000 per occurrence. (Only used if a motor vehicle is to be used in the contract.)

NOTE: In addition, various Professional Liability/Errors and Omissions coverages are required when soliciting those services as follows:

Professional Services Limit:

\$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$3,000,000 aggregate

- R. **ANNOUNCEMENT OF AWARD:** Upon the award of contract, VRT will notify all bidders of the outcome of this solicitation.
- S. <u>DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE</u>: During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees to (i) provide a drug-free workplace for the contractor's employees; (ii) post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance or marijuana is prohibited in the contractor's workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition; (iii) state in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor that the contractor maintains a drug-free workplace; and (iv) include the provisions of the foregoing clauses in every subcontract or purchase order of over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor.

For the purposes of this section, "drug-free workplace" means a site for the performance of work done in connection with a specific contract awarded to a contractor, the employees of whom are prohibited from engaging in the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of any controlled substance or marijuana during the performance of the contract.

- T. **BID PRICE CURRENCY**. Unless stated otherwise in the solicitation, bidders shall state bid prices in US dollars.
- U. <u>AUTHORIZATION TO CONDUCT BUSINESS IN THE COMMONWEALTH</u>: A contractor organized as a stock or nonstock corporation, limited liability company, business trust, or limited partnership or registered as a registered limited liability partnership shall be authorized to transact business in the Commonwealth as a domestic or foreign business entity if so required by Title 13.1 or Title 50 of the Code of Virginia or as otherwise required by law. Any business entity described above enters a contract with a public body pursuant to the Virginia Public Procurement Act shall not allow its existence to lapse or its certificate of authority or registration to transact business in the Commonwealth, if so required under Title 13.1 or Title 50, to be

revoked or cancelled at any time during the term of the contract. A public body may void any contract with a business entity if the business entity fails to remain in compliance with the provisions of this section.

BID ACCEPTANCE PERIOD: Any bid in response to this solicitation shall be valid for 120 days. At the end of the 120 days the proposal may be withdrawn at the written request of the bidder. If the proposal is not withdrawn at that time it remains in effect until an award is made or the solicitation is canceled.

CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT: VRT reserves the right to cancel and terminate any resulting contract in part or in whole, without penalty, upon 60 days' written notice to the contractor. In the event the initial contract period is for more than 12 months, the resulting contract may be terminated by either party, without penalty, after the 12 months of the contract period upon 60 days' written notice to the other party. Any contract cancellation notice shall not relieve the contractor of the obligation to deliver and/or perform on all outstanding orders issued prior to the effective date of cancellation.

INDEMNIFICATION: Contractor agrees to indemnify, and defend and hold harmless VRT, its agents, officers, Board Members, and employees from any claims, damages and actions of any kind or nature, whether at law or in equity, arising from or caused by the use of any materials, goods, or equipment of any kind or nature furnished by the contractor/any services of any kind or nature furnished by the contractor, provided that such liability is not attributable to the sole negligence of the using agency or to failure of the using agency to use the materials, goods, ore equipment in the manner already and permanently described by the contractor on the materials, goods or equipment delivered.

ACCURRACY/COMPETITION: By submitting a bid, bidders certify that all information provided in response to this IFB is true and accurate. Failure to provide information required by this IFB may ultimately result in rejection of the bid.

ADDITIONAL COSTS: No service fees or additional costs will be invoiced to VRT by the Contractor during the term of the contract except as allowed for in the contract.

V. Method of Payment

The Contractor will be paid based on invoices submitted. The Contractor shall submit invoices within thirty (30) days after completion of the work performed. All invoices are to have State taxes omitted from the master bill. Submit invoices to the address on the cover page of this IFB.
